This half term, our learning theme will be wheels in motion. We will be learning about journeys and different types of transport, both past and present.

Literacy- As usual, our Literacy will be based around books linked to our current learning, wheels in motion. We will have a variety of non-fiction and fiction texts.

Maths- In Maths, we will be learning about 3D shapes, recognizing patterns of the counting system, learning to use a rekenrek and continuing to deepen our understanding of number.

Expressive arts and design- In EAD, we will be investigating the best type of materials for different purposes, including designing and making our own boats.

Please remember ...

Please ensure your child's **reading book and library book** comes to school EVERYDAY in their bag.

At home, please can you...

Please **listen to your child read** their reading book at least 4 times a week and ensure that you are recording their progress in their reading record. Remember to encourage them to "say the sounds and read the word". Let's get our little Acorn's to their next reading award and become fluent readers, who show a love for reading!

Practice writing numbers with your child the right way round. This could be in any form, such as with chalk, on a whiteboard or using a paintbrush in water on the pavement.

Please **practice writing sentences** in day-to-day life using fingers spaces, a capital letter at the beginning and a full stop at the end of a sentence. Encourage independence when sounding words out.
